RE: Expansion of community-based pharmacist services to include vaccination for COVID-19

As specified in the *Regulatory Bylaws of the Saskatchewan College of Pharmacy Professionals* Part L, section 4:

General Prohibition on Administering Drugs to Certain Minors:

Notwithstanding anything in this Part L, a publicly funded vaccination may only be administered to a patient whose age is nine years and over, or as may be specified by the Chief Medical Health Officer for the Province of Saskatchewan. Non-publicly funded vaccinations may only be administered in accordance with the age limits under the Saskatchewan Immunization Manual, Canadian Immunization Guide and the vaccine's official product monograph.

Pursuant to the above noted bylaw, effective April 22, 2021, the Chief Medical Health Officer for the Province of Saskatchewan authorizes pharmacists to provide publicly funded COVID-19 vaccine to patients as specified in letters dated January 27, 2021, and March 25, 2021 and below:

- I. Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine youth and adults 12 years of age or older, as per official product monograph.
- II. Moderna vaccine adults 18 years of age or older, as per official product monograph.
- III. AstraZeneca vaccine adults 18 years of age and older, as per official product monograph.
- IV. COVISHIELD vaccine adults 18 years of age and older, as per official product monograph.
- V. Janssen vaccine adults 18 years of age and older, as per official product monograph.
