Appraisal Site Information

The appraisal site and the supervising/assessing pharmacist(s) ('appraisal pharmacist' or 'appraiser') must meet the following criteria:

- The appraiser and his/her delegates must be in good standing¹ with SCPP and not be the subject of any open SCPP complaint investigations;
- The pharmacy/proprietor must be in good standing with SCPP and not be the subject of any open complaint investigations;
- The appraiser and the appraisal site must be free from any potential conflict(s) of interest that could impact the candidate from receiving an unbiased appraisal. All potential conflict(s) of interest should be disclosed to SCPP before an application is made.

¹ "good standing" – in terms of the Appraisal Site Application, requires that the member/proprietor is not suspended or otherwise prohibited from practice/operation; is not the subject of any open complaint investigation or other investigations; and has not had a recent (within the last five years) discipline decision and order.

- The appraiser must have the consent of the pharmacy manager of the appraisal site pharmacy to be an appraiser;
- The appraisal pharmacist must have 6000 hours (3 years) of pharmacist practise experience in Canada;
- The pharmacy site must be able to provide the candidate with adequate exposure to the requirements of pharmacy practise in Saskatchewan;
- The pharmacy site has a variety of patients with acute illnesses and/or chronic conditions;
- The site offers an adequate patient population with a variety of health care service needs of adequate intensity, breadth, depth, structure, and duration to enable candidates to gain the required experience (competences) with Saskatchewan pharmacy practice;
- The site offers experiences and provides clinical services that integrate, reinforce, and advance the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values required for contemporary pharmacy practice, including collaboration and teamwork (e.g., both inter and intraprofessional collaboration);
- The site exhibits a culture of engagement and includes an adequate number of support staff collaborating in a positive working environment;
- The site has adequate space and access to appropriate technology (library resources, computer, internet, etc.)
- It is strongly recommended that the appraiser and his/her delegates have completed preceptor training, as outlined in the <u>Appraisal Phase Responsibilities of the Candidate</u> <u>and Appraiser</u>. The appraisal is to occur at one site.
