

The Appraisal and Assessment Program for internationally trained/ foreign pharmacy graduates can accept a maximum of 10 candidates for membership in the program at one time. Additional candidates for membership will be queued for entrance into the program after completion of preregistration.

Note: some of these steps may be completed in a different order in which they are outlined here or simultaneously, as permitted.

Please note <u>Document</u> <u>Requirements</u>

Enroll as a candidate through Pharmacists' Gateway Canada for International Pharmacists. You will need to obtain a Pharmacist's Gateway Canada National ID number.

Obtain the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) <u>Certificate of</u> <u>Qualification</u>. Obtain proof of language proficiency (see SCPP Language Proficiency Policy)
per the National Association of
Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities
(NAPRA) Language Proficiency
Requirements for Licensure as a
Pharmacist in Canada.

Obtain Certificate(s) of Standing from all professional regulatory authorities or pharmacy licensing bodies in which you hold or have held membership/been a registrant. Note that SCPP will not accept certificates of standing that are dated more than 1 year from the date of submission of the pre-registration application form.

Provide SCPP with a notarized copy of a valid Canadian passport or Canadian governmentissued photo identification.

Complete the <u>SCPP Pre-Registration Application form</u>. Please note that you should NOT complete and submit the application form until you are able to provide all required documentation.

Pay the non-refundable Pre-Registration Application fee.
